On Mobile phones....

As you maybe aware the Government and DFE have made a stance on mobile phones in schools.

Mobile phones will be strictly forbidden at INWS. No student is allowed to enter the premises with a mobile phone. If your child fails to hand in their phone at the door or is caught using a mobile phone, an instant suspension will be issued and it is the duty of the Parent or Carer to collect the child from school if a suspension is issued. Any transport costs incurred to the schools as a result of a failure to collect will be passed onto the Parent or Carer.

Arbor Parent Portal Login

As a Parent or Carer, what do I need to know?

The government and DFE have the way they monitor school attendance.

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE IS CHANGING

FIRST OFFENCE

1

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

2

SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

The following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.



THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates; fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education'.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHOURISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthourised absence in a 10-week period.

This means we will look at your income and expenditure, which as any income that is available to you and may include income we usually ignore when looking at claims for Housing Benefit and/or Council Tax Reduction.
